**Exegesis** Reads out of scripture exactly what the original author intended for the original reader to understand. (Authorial Intent, in context)

**Eisegesis** Reads into or interprets scripture in order to make a point that may or may not have been originally intended or for that matter may not even be correct. (Taken out of context.)

**Philippians 3:16** ...Only live up to what you have <u>already attained.</u> (Past Tense)

Consider as an acronym...

What we have *Attained* is not a place of rest, but a place from which we grow.

At first it means don't backslide, but in reality, means to keep pressing on. Read 3:4(b) thru 3:16
